It contains the westernmost islands of the Outer Hebrides of Scotland. The largest island is Hirta, whose sea cliffs are the highest in the United Kingdom.

Lying 41 miles off the west coast of Benbecula, the archipelago of St Kilda is an extreme Atlantic outpost, and one of the few World Heritage Sites in existence awarded 'Dual' status for meeting both the natural and cultural criteria for the classification. With its clear waters and craggy sea cliffs (including one that ranks as Europe ' s highest) it is not surprising that St Kilda is home to the continent ' s largest colony of seabirds including gannets and puffins.

St Kilda was continuously inhabited for two millennia or more, from the Bronze Age to the 20th century. The islands were historically part of the domain of the MacLeods of Harris whose steward was responsible for the collection of rents in kind and other duties. T
